<u>How was this word chosen?</u> This is an academic word, the kind of word that takes *lots* of exposures to learn, and that children will need to know to read texts successfully in the years to come.

The Abound app gives your child 7 opportunities to hear and use the week's abstract word. For extra practice, here are 3 more questions about this week's word, **UNITE**.

(UNITE definition: to bring things or people together. To come together about an important cause.

- If there were a really big snowstorm and the plows didn't get a chance to remove the snow from our street, do you think we could get the neighborhood to UNITE and remove the snow? How?
- 2. Countries often UNITE to help a countries that has had an earthquake or a bad storm that caused a lot of damage. How do you think countries UNITING helps? Why wouldn't every country just do what it wants to do to help, on its own?
- 3. If the school could afford to pay for one improvement or new piece of equipment on the playground, do you think the students could **UNITE** on what to do, or do you think students would have such different opinions that they could never **UNITE** about a playground improvement?
