WordUp word of the week: Normal

<u>How was this word chosen?</u> This is an academic word, the kind of word that takes *lots* of exposures to learn, and that children will need to know to read texts successfully in the years to come.

The Abound app gives your child 7 opportunities to hear and use the week's abstract word. For extra practice, here are 2 more questions about this week's word, **NORMAL.**

(NORMAL definition: ordinary, not unusual, not strange; doing things the way things are usually done. Physically healthy (i.e., a NORMAL temperature.)

- Do you like having a **NORMAL** Saturday, where you do the things you usually do, or do you like having lots of different kinds of things planned? Why?
- Do you think that dogs **NORMALLY** hate the rain or other bad weather, or do you think most dogs like being outside no matter what the weather is like?

This week's featured *TalkOn* questions to inspire more TALK at home:

(Find new questions each day on the Abound app!)

- Water freezes when the temperature is 32 degrees Fahrenheit. We say it's below freezing outside when the temperature goes below 32 degrees. What are some ways we can tell that the temperature is below freezing just by looking outside?
- Can you snap your fingers? We use the expression cold snap when there is a sudden, short period of cold weather. Why do you think the phrase cold snap makes sense?
