## Build reading skills while connecting with your child: Use Abound to talk back-and-forth about ideas, words & books.

"Oral language skills are the best preparation for literacy achievement, in both first and second language learners."

- This week's academic vocabulary word is APPROPRIATE. Here are 3 ways to give your child extra opportunities to hear and use the word APPROPRIATE:
  - On a quiet Sunday morning, do you think it's **APPROPRIATE** for people to use loud lawnmowers or for workers to cut down trees? When is it **APPROPRIATE** to use loud machines near where people live, and when isn't it **APPROPRIATE**?
  - Sometimes when you are invited someplace, it's hard to know what's APPROPRIATE to wear. How do you know what's APPROPRIATE to wear to a party or a school event?
  - o It's INAPPROPRIATE to burp loudly at a dinner table on purpose, but if you burp at the table by accident, what should you do? What else is INAPPROPRIATE to do during a meal with a group of people? Does it matter who the people are that you're sitting with? How are people supposed to know what's APPROPRIATE and what's INAPPROPRIATE?
    - ♦ Remind your child that the word APPROPRIATE means the right thing to do in a certain situation. If something is INAPPROPRIATE, that means that it is not APPROPRIATE. The prefix IN means not or the opposite of the word that follows.
- How else can you build your child's reading skills through TALK?
  Try these questions taken from different TalkOn age groups this week:
  - Etch-A-Sketch is a toy that first sold about 70 years ago. Say etch and sketch slowly. What sound is at the end of each word? (/ch/) How many other words that have the /ch/ sound can we think of in 60 seconds?
  - What makes certain toys tub toys, toys used in the bathtub? Do you ever play with tub toys anywhere else? Can you bring regular toys into the bath? Why
  - Which toy that you have (or know about) is a toy that you think an adult would like to play with? Do you think that's something you'll want to play with when you're all grown up? Why?
  - How do you think they decide what kinds of toys to put in the waiting room at a doctor's office? What needs to be considered before choosing those toys?
