Lots of parents are asking themselves if their young children are on track with reading skills.

You don't have to wonder and worry.

Take the Abound Benchmark Check-In (in the app Menu) and get an idea of how your child is doing. Then, when you go into your conference this fall, you'll have a handle on where things stand and be better able to work with your child's teacher.

- This week's WordUp word is AVAILABLE. Here are 2 *more* ways to give your child opportunities to hear and use this abstract word.
 - o If you when you went to pick up your baseball uniform and the only hat size **AVAILABLE** was too big for your head, what could you do?
 - Sometimes stores don't have all sizes AVAILABLE for people to buy. Why do you think stores only keep some clothes sizes in the store, and don't have every size and every color AVAILABLE?
 - AVAILABILITY tells us if something is AVAILABLE. In stores, a sign saying Limited AVAILABILITY means there are not that many AVAILABLE; you may or may not be able to get it. At home, why do you think there's often limited AVAILABILITY of matching socks??
 - Remind your child that when something is AVAILABLE, it means it is ready to use or it's possible for you to get it.
