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- This week's academic vocabulary word is ACCOMPANY. Here are 2 ways to give your child extra opportunities to hear and use the word ACCOMPANY!
  - ♦ If you had to go to the doctor's office for a check-up, who would you want to ACCOMPANY you? Why would you pick that person to ACCOMPANY you?
  - Why do you think dogs are allowed to ACCOMPANY their owners into pet stores? Why can't dogs ACCOMPANY their owners in most other stores?
    - Remind your child that the word **ACCOMPANY** means to go with someone somewhere.

  - Try these questions taken from different TalkOn age groups this week!
    - ◆ Let's say the two syllables in **trom-bone**. If we take away the first syllable, what does that last syllable sound like? (bone) Some **trombone** players call their instrument by this word!

    - Would you rather go to a movie where the actors spoke in a different language, or a concert where the singers sang in a different language? Why?
