- This week's academic vocabulary word is CONSTRUCT. Here are 2 ways to give your child extra opportunities to hear and use the word CONSTRUCT!
  - Why do you think it takes so long to CONSTRUCT a house? Can you think of a few tools the workers use while they're doing CONSTRUCTION?
