- This week's academic vocabulary word is ESTIMATE. Here are 2 ways to give your child extra opportunities to hear and use the word ESTIMATE!
 - ◆ Can you **ESTIMATE** how many books you read in 2021? Is there any way we could figure out the exact number you read? (Which ones were your favorites?)
 - If we were going to make cupcakes for a family birthday party, how would we know how many to make? Do you think it would be better to ESTIMATE about how many to make, or try to figure out <u>exactly</u> how many we'd need so there would be enough for everyone, but none left over?
 - Remind your child that the word ESTIMATE means to guess based on whatever information you have.

 - o Try these questions taken from different TalkOn age groups this week!
 - ◆ Listen to the compound words forklift, backhoe and bobcat. Which two words make up each compound word? Now, let's make up some crazysounding construction vehicles by putting the six words together in different groups of two! (E.g., forkcat!)
 - Construction workers sometimes wear ear plugs on the job because it's so noisy. So how do they communicate with each other?
 - ◆ If you were on a road work crew and had to go way below the street to work on the pipes, how would you feel going into the hole? Would you say something if you weren't happy about working below ground?
