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- **This week's academic vocabulary word is RELY.** Here are 2 ways to give your child extra opportunities to hear and use the word **RELY**!
 - ◆ *Who is someone you **RELY** on more than anyone else? Can you think of a time when that person was there for you when you needed him or her the most? Who **RELIES** on you?*
 - ◆ *If you had to walk to school every day in snowy winters, you'd have to **RELY** on other people to shovel the sidewalks you walk along to get there. What would happen if the sidewalk shoveler or plow driver wasn't **RELIABLE**? Could you get to school anyway?*
 - *Remind your child that the word **RELY** means to depend on something or someone; to trust that a person will do what he says.*
- **How else can you build your child's reading skills through TALK?**
 - Try these questions taken from different TalkOn age groups this week!
 - ◆ *Sports fans **sit** in the **stands** (which seems kind of funny). Let's see how many words we can think of that rhyme with **stands**. (e.g., hands, bands)*
 - ◆ *With some sports, the winner is the one who goes the **fastest**, and in others, the winner gets the most **points**. How does a person win at skating or weightlifting? Let's name as many sports as we can and figure out how a winner is decided in each one.*
 - ◆ *Professional sports players often get **traded** to other teams. That means that players might have played for one team for years, and then suddenly become a member of a **new team** they used to play against. What do you think that's like?*

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
