- This week's academic vocabulary word is RELY. Here are 2 ways to give your child extra opportunities to hear and use the word RELY!
 - ♦ Who is someone you **RELY** on more than anyone else? Can you think of a time when that person was there for you when you needed him or her the most? Who **RELIES** on you?
 - ♦ If you had to walk to school every day in snowy winters, you'd have to RELY on other people to shovel the sidewalks you walk along to get there. What would happen if the sidewalk shoveler or plow driver wasn't RELIABLE? Could you get to school anyway?
 - Remind your child that the word RELY means to depend on something or someone; to trust that a person will do what he says.

 - ◆ Sports fans **sit** in the **stands** (which seems kind of funny). Let's see how many words we can think of that rhyme with **stands**. (e.g., hands, bands)
