- This week's academic vocabulary word is JUSTIFY. Here are 2 ways to give your child extra opportunities to hear and use the word JUSTIFY!
 - ◆ If your brother or sister took money from you to buy themselves something, would you think they were JUSTIFIED in taking the money? What if they used your money to buy groceries for someone who was hungry and didn't have any money? Then are they JUSTIFIED?
 - ♦ If you get money for doing your chores, do you think you are JUSTIFIED in spending it any way you want to?
 - Remind your child that the word JUSTIFY means to have a good reason for something.
