- This week's academic vocabulary word is ASSIST. Here are 2 ways to ASSIST (!) your child in learning the word ASSIST ©

    - Would you rather listen to a scary story in a bright room at the library or around a campfire in the woods? What might be better about being in the library, or about being in the woods?
