





DATE: October 25, 2013

On October 4, 2013, the Lower Fields Committee (established in the Memorandum of Understanding that governs the Lower Fields) convened for its first annual meeting. In attendance were: Steve Mills, Don Aicardi, JD Head, Steve Desy, Denise Kelly, Erin Bettez, Bobby Glenn (representing the school district); Anne-Marie Sweeney (Pop Warner Rep.), Brian Cotter (AB Lax Rep.), Chris Habersaat (ABYS President), Jen Orcutt (AB Girls Lax President), Tim Kelly (FOLF Treasurer), Dave Wilson and Chip Orcutt (FOLF). The Lower Fields Committee oversees the operations and governance of the facility and reviews financial reports submitted to the ABRSD by FOLF.

JD Head provided a construction update:

- Auxiliary lot is paved, to be striped shortly. There are currently no plans to plow it
 during the winter. The additional spots mean we now have enough spaces to require
 five handicapped spots. JD is working on this with the Town. Despite the additional
 parking, many people continue to park illegally and receive tickets. One suggestion
 made was to have a monitor there to direct people to the lots at the high school.
- The Town of Acton is planning to issue an RFP for work on the skate park.
- NSTAR still needs to remove a pole at the main entrance to the field.
- Cameras are installed and working we are looking at options to improve picture quality.
- GC has submitted a final invoice to be paid once credits are reflected.
- Bricks purchased by donors are on site (with a second shipment en route) and will be installed this fall by a boy as his Eagle Scout project.
- Signage is in process.

Erin Bettez reported on Operations:

• Community Ed. is paying for facilities OT clean up on both Saturday and Sunday as the level of use requires cleaning both nights.

- Snack shack is open every weekend and Comm. Ed. is experimenting with weekday
 afternoons during school games and weekday evenings to see which timeslots are
 profitable.
- Comm. Ed. has sold 4 signs to advertisers (New London Style Pizza, Achieve Physical Therapy, Prestigious Tree and Gallant Insurance – each a two year contract) and is looking to increase this number.

Dave Wilson provided an update from FOLF regarding rentals:

- The fields are fully booked for the fall season through the second week of November. Late evenings in Spring 2014 are almost full with the same or more reservations in total than during the first year. There are tournaments booked for Thanksgiving Weekend as well as in February and March.
- FOLF is looking at online scheduling systems as they are currently booked now by Dave Scheuer who does it as a volunteer and it is a lot of work.

Tim Kelly provided a financial update from FOLF:

- FY13 final rental income (gross): \$222,034.59
- FY14 rental income to date: \$205,492.50
- Based upon the amount of time booked, a maximum yearly rental income in the \$200-\$240K range is likely. Available hours tend to be in the hottest part of summer when the turf is less desirable as it is hotter than a grass field and other turf facilities continue to be built in the region, adding new options for renters.
- FOLF is building up its reserve account and should be able to contribute to maintenance and the bond payment as per the MOU.

Soccer nets that are not being used are parked along the fence and just beyond the field boundary lines. Their proximity to the field of play poses a potential safety hazard and kids have run right into them. Many coaches/parents/renters have complained. The best solution is to create pockets in the fence where unused nets can be parked. Bobby Glenn has priced additional fencing required and is getting a price for composite decking on which the nets would sit as the best location for the pockets is along the route 2 side where we need to be cognizant of wetlands/setbacks. Initial cost estimate is \$15K total.

Committee noted the need for lighting in the new auxiliary parking lot and along the access road from the baseball field. Users are encouraged to use these areas but the walk from each area to the fields is extremely dark. JD is looking into options, with the new rear lot as first priority.

Wish List

1. Grooming Machine — all turf fields require regular grooming to remove debris and ensure that infill materials are distributed at a constant depth. Grooming prevents compaction and ensures proper porosity. We groom Leary Field and now the new turf fields two times per year at a cost of \$1,750 per grooming (or \$10,500 annually). A

- grooming machine costs \$15,000 and would therefore pay for itself in 1.5 years. This seems like a prudent investment.
- 2. More sand bags users are taking the ones that hold the netting and putting them on the goals, leaving gaps between the fields.
- 3. Player Benches no good solution yet as permanent ones affect safety/usability of turf and non-permanent ones tend to disappear.
- 4. Sound System all agreed this is a "nice to have" once safety items are addressed.
- 5. Stands also a "nice to have" though not clear where these could go and if portable ones would suffice versus permanent/in-place.

Miscellaneous

AB Lax is looking into buying wheels that attach to the lacrosse nets so they can be moved more easily and less likely damage the turf.

Acton Boxborough Regional School Committee (ABRSC) and Acton Boxborough Transitional School Committee (ABTSC) Regionalization Update October 2013

The 2013-14 school year is what the School Committees in both Acton and Boxborough are calling a "transitional year", the year in which all the planning related to expanding our school district to include both Acton and Boxborough from Pre-K through grade 12 will occur. In order to keep both parents and other community members informed, the ABRSC and ABTSC has begun a monthly update of the issues being addressed that relate to this transition. Transportation Update

At our October 3rd School Committee meeting, JD Head, our Director of Facilities and Transportation, presented a first look at a possible new transportation plan for next year, which could transition the elementary schools to a "one-tier" schedule (e.g., all elementary schools in Acton and Boxborough would begin and end at the same time every year).

While many details remain to be addressed, JD has demonstrated that it may be possible to succeed in this regard, while making our overall transportation program run more efficiently. Briefly, a number of buses would be assigned to each school (Merriam and McCarthy-Towne would be grouped together, as would Gates and Douglas, while Blanchard and Conant would stand alone), and those buses would pick up children and drop them at their respective schools for the same start time.

There are both pros and cons to this new idea; benefits include overall greater efficiency in having fuller buses, less idling time, more convenience for families, and additional resources to service extracurricular bus needs and ease secondary level overcrowding. Bus passing will continue as it currently does in Acton and will be expanded to include Boxborough; even now, occasionally a bus is "full" and cannot accept bus passes, but that is not a common problem and is not expected to become a significant issue. There are some potential drawbacks to this one-tier idea: the system may be slightly more expensive, some bus stops may be eliminated, there may be additional buses running through neighborhoods, and we may face challenges with driver retention and hiring.

There was sufficient interest in further developing this plan, and the School Committee asked JD to present a second iteration of this plan to the Regional School Committee, targeting our meeting on December 5th.

Principal Search Process/Blanchard Elementary

Currently, Dr. Curtis Bates serves as both the Superintendent of Boxborough and the Principal of the Blanchard School. When the districts are fully regionalized, we will only require a principal at Blanchard, and the search has begun for a candidate to fill that position. The search committee is being facilitated by Marie Altieri, Director of Personnel and Administration for the Acton-Boxborough Regional School District, and includes faculty and staff, parents and community members.

The search committee has begun meeting, the position has been advertised and posted, and the search committee has received a number of applications. They expect to select candidates to interview by late October, with the hope of making a decision by late December.

School Calendar Review Process

As there are currently differences between the Acton and Boxborough school calendars, the School Committee has begun the process of evaluating our options for reconciling those differences, particularly in the area of religious holidays, start date for the first day of school, and Thursday schedule. An e-mail survey was sent to parents via the school principals on Friday, September 20th, and survey results were discussed at the October 3rd Regional School Committee meeting.

As a result of the survey responses, Dr. Steve Mills has presented two options for the 2014-15 school year: both start after Labor Day (which is Sept. 1, 2014); Option A includes Rosh Hashanah and Good Friday as "no school" days (Yom Kippur is on a Saturday in 2014), while Option B shows school scheduled on those religious holidays.

The calendar will be voted on at the November 7^{th} Transitional School Committee meeting.

Mission, Values and Goals Policy

At its October 3, 2013 meeting, the ABTSC reviewed proposed revisions to the policies on Mission and Values (AD) and Goals (ADA). The Policy Subcommittee has recommended combining these two policies into one and making other related modifications. This was a first read of the proposed revisions. The ABTSC will vote on the proposed revisions at its November 7, 2013 meeting.

Elementary Enrollment Report/Class Size Guidelines Update

At our October 17th meeting, Marie Altieri, Director of Personnel and Administration presented the annual Enrollment Report, in which recent enrollment changes were documented and projected for 2014-15. Key information presented included a review of class size guidelines in Acton and Boxborough as well as projections for the number of elementary classes and their projected sizes for next year.

Currently, the class size guidelines are slightly different in Acton and Boxborough. Acton recommends no more than 22 students in grades K-3, with no more than 25 students in grades 4-6. Boxborough recommends no more than 20 students per Kindergarten class, with no more than 22 in grades 1-3 and no more than 24 in grades 4-6. Boxborough recently did a detailed review of the literature and analysis of the issue of class size, and Marie Altieri explained the benefits of smaller Kindergarten classes. She has asked the School Committee to reconcile the differences in these policies, which the Policy Subcommittee will be doing in the near future.

In addition, Acton Elementary Parents have been notified via their principals of the opportunity to transfer to the Blanchard Memorial School in Boxborough for the 2014-2015 school year on a space-available basis. Class sizes at Blanchard are currently smaller at some grade levels, and transportation will be provided from Acton homes to Blanchard beginning September 2014.

Regionalization Financial Benefits

The Regionalization Study Committee estimated that there would be approximately \$986,000 in financial benefits in the first year of regionalization. Of this amount, \$402,050 was due to estimated personnel savings. An Administrative Transitional Team has been meeting each week to work through the implementation plans for the expanded Region. At this time, this Administrative Transitional Team has estimated \$419,000 in personnel savings. The details of these savings were provided on page 41 of the School Committee packet of information for the October 3, 2013 meeting.

Other News

Track Renovation Project

As of this writing, the AB Track Renovation Committee was very close to meeting their goal of raising \$450,000 to renovate the Richard E. Dow track surrounding Leary Field. Fundraising will continue in hopes of improving the track design to include an eight-lane straightaway, but enough money has been raised to date to move ahead at this point.

The school district will contribute up to \$150,000 towards the project, which will be completed in two phases to minimize the impact to the school and youth sports teams that use the track and Leary Field. Favorably priced project bids have been received, and vendor selection due diligence is ongoing. The project is expected to be awarded in early November.

There have been innumerable community members involved in getting the project to this point; many thanks for all you've done so far!

ABRSD Superintendent Search Committee Update

Our School Superintendent, Dr. Stephen Mills, recently announced his retirement planned for the end of this school year. The School Committee has begun the process to find a new Superintendent.

The School Committee will be using the services of Future Management Systems, a search firm, to assist with the recruitment of candidates. A consultant from FMS will be working with the search committee during its review of candidates. The search committee has been selected and will begin meeting in early November, and will review applications in mid-December. Interviews with candidates will take place immediately after Winter Break, and then once finalists are identified - a public process will take place that ends with the School Committee appointing a new Superintendent by the end of January (for a July 1 start date).

The official job posting has now been finalized and is listed in EdWeek magazine, as well as other professional association sites. Applications will be accepted until December 3, 2013.

We have also created a website for the Superintendent search. The address is: www.absuptsearch.com -- the purpose of this website is to provide an initial entry point for potential candidates, where they can learn about the search process and get an initial glimpse at our District. This website is not intended to be a comprehensive overview of the District, but rather a snapshot. Feel free to pass along the website address to colleagues and friends who may be interested in the position. Those who visit the website can download a PDF flyer that also offers some highlights of the District and includes the details of the search process.

ABTSC Support for Senate Bill 228

At their meeting on 10/17/13, the Acton-Boxborough Transitional School Committee was presented with information on Senate Bill 228, an act relative to regional school district capital project funding, by Nancy Banks and Cheryl Mahoney, respective Acton and Boxborough representatives on the Minuteman District School Committee.

The majority of the AB Transitional School Committee is in favor of this Bill because it is supportive of regional school districts. This is particularly important given that we will be fully regionalized as a PreK-12 district starting July 1, 2014. The Chair of the ABTSC has sent a letter of support to Senator Eldridge, Representative Benson and Representative Atkins.

DESE Ranks Acton-Boxborough Regional High School Level One

Massachusetts' state system places schools and districts on a five-level scale, ranking the highest performing in Level 1 and lowest performing in Level 5. Acton-Boxborough has historically been a Level 1 high school; however, we received a rating of level 2 at the end of last year based on a slightly lower MCAS participation by some groups of students with legitimate excused absences.

Deborah Bookis, Director of Curriculum and Assessment, reports that we have received official word from MA DESE (Department of Elementary and Secondary Education) that the high school's accountability rating was restored back from Level 2 to Level 1 after the initial rating was appealed. Using data district officials provided, they adjusted the district's participation rate, which resulted in the change. This will be reflected on DESE's site when they reload accountability data later this fall.

Dear School Committee Members,

I have been a loyal swimmer at Acton-Boxborough high school for at least 5 years through the adult ed program. I have enjoyed the experience very much until recently. For over a year the showers have been cold in the women's locker room except for in one handicap shower where the drain is plugged. The other swimmers and I have called to complain many times over the past year and a half and although the story has changed here and there, nothing has been done about it. To be more specific, the temperature of the cold showers have fluctuated between 74 and 80 degrees and according to the Acton Board of Health, the state code says that showers are supposed to be 110 degrees.

In case you are unaware of what has been going on in the women's locker room, let me back up a bit. Some time around April-June 2012 the plumbing broke and the showers were shut off at the main valve. Over the summer the main mixing valve was replaced and the showers were turned back on, but the temperature was cold. In September 2012 we were told that it would be fixed soon but it never was. So here we are a year later still with no hot water except for if we want to wait in line for the one handicap shower. Since the drain is plugged in that shower, it overflows and the water has to travel across the hallway into the drain below the mass group of showers. It's disgusting and unsanitary! I would think that since it is the only usable shower in the entire locker room that someone would have snaked the drain in that year and a half since the plumbing originally broke, but it has not been. It's not fair to us, the paying customers of the pool, or to the students of the school district that the showers are cold. They are not showering after gym class due to this problem.

I am not sure if you have been aware of this problem or not, but something needs to happen or the paying swimmers are going to go elsewhere. Please help us, we want to stay! We have overlooked the filth of the locker room for years, but warm showers are something we cannot do without. Please let me know if you would like me to come to one of your meetings to discuss this problem, I would be happy to.
